I sure appreciated getting your letter and think it is wonderful that Lula made the 9th. grade in school. You, and all the rest of us, I think, have a right to be proud of her. Hope Cuca and Jesse will soon have enough of the English language at their command so that the going won't seem quite rough. They are at a good age to learn it, - at least I've always thought it was easier for children than for older people, to learn a different language.

Monday afternoon, and this letter still unfinished. Have been having a painful attack of nueritis in my right shoulder and I couldn't think of very much else except how bad it hurt. Went to a Chiropractor yesterday afternoon and again this morning and it seems now to be about cleared up.

Hope you have found work that you like and have a nice warm place in which to do it. From the weather reports in the Sanford paper it must be pretty chilly down there and I am glad too, that it worked out for Lorina to keep you housed there, anyway until warm weather comes again and you've had a chance to get adjusted to the cold. But getting adjusted to it is something that I don't think will ever happen to me. We are just coming out from under another blanket of snow, with another snow storm due to arrive tomorrow. Elathier doesn't seem to mind it a bit. Puts on a hooded raincoat and rubber boots and goes on about her business. Is like Herbert in that way.

Did you see Mr. Fisher's garden project when you saw him in DeLand? Herbert and I were there one Sunday afternoon a few years ago with Bob and Agnes Moule. Bob has developed quite a garden and chicken raising hobby and He and Fisher used to get together to compare notes occasionally.
