yours letters have been here several days,

could work and get something done. Then I

health, some clothes, and plenty of something
to eat and drink, have to scurry for a red
hole a couple of times a night while bombs
fall. Thanksgiving is an American day and
Spanish people don't know anything about it. so
it happened to be the day that Remedios picked
to spend with her mother and she and the kids
were over there. she was sorry when I told her
it had been Thanksgiving. I should have been
sorry too, if instead of the letters you had all
have walked in on me in person. Busy at the
mill and with little time to inclination to cook
I was content with a plate of granola oats.
and thankfull as could be, for that and for
one of the dearest of little wives and 3 of
about as nice little kids as one could find

They grow so fast, sometimes I hardly know if they are mine as no. Gilda and ~~Francesca~~
nice little girls, soon ready for school, and
the boy, well he is just all boy, with a big
P. Remedios just loves him to death and takes
such good care of all of us. They are all over
at the farm for the day, will go and bring them
home again later. Bertha I suggest some of
you out there in mild and wooly will have
us all ^{by then} for Christmas, don't let us catch you
with only a can & quaker oats, for me it would
be O.K. but some of the crowd like Chocolat cake
so better have one handly. Was sure glad to see
you ariet, you see it was really my idea only
Bertha and George so much nearer by beat me
to it, well no matter for that us old fellows
have to let baby sister run some times and since
you are established in the circle it is just fine.

Was also glad to see yours letters Ruth and shall
always be glad to see them if sometimes you can't
write a letter you can just pen a note saying you
are well and etc. and letters when you can. I hope ^{think} this
will find yours health improved since yours last
letter. some a little of the work for others don't try to
do it all, my competitors here have gone out of business
and I bought their principal ^{handle} machinery, one of those
strange case of the mouse eating cat, naturally a bit
indigestion and etc. but I guess the mouse will
survive and anyway the cat is no more. also there ^{is}
seems to be no more paper and I just haven't written
