Dear Jessie

I am sorry to have kept you waiting so long for an answer to your letter. The main cause for the delay has been the uncertainty of Herbert's condition. Since I wrote before, <sup>he</sup> has felt good enough to start 3 times for the office & each time before he got there I've had to rush him home & to bed because of that pain in his leg. X-Rays about 10 days ago shows contracted ligaments tensions where the muscles join the hip bone. The Dr. here don't believe he might be facing another operation. However about 4 days ago he began feeling much better & went to Islands for a check-up yesterday. They gave him a thorough examination & say the trouble is definitely clearing up & he will, or should, be O.K. real soon. They say it is a neuritis condition. He sure don't want any more operations & we hope neither you nor Ragin ever catch up with him on that score. There are some amusing things about it though to laugh about after it is over. Like somebody throwing rocks thru the window at you & Herbert for the 1st 3 days working as hard as his desk work. Sorting papers, writing reports

+ wanting explanations from some of the other help on some of the bills. He went thru all the motions, just like he was really doing it talking to himself all the time.

You mentioned having lumps from injection for malaria. I had 3 for the same reason in 1925 + still have 2 of them. The 3rd one in 1938 became sore + inflamed + I went to the Dr. He examined it + said it was a cyst. + to come back 2 days later + had lanced it. I told him about the injection + he looked at me like he thought I was just plain lying. However, I think he used a hypodermic needle + when I left the office I asked him what he got out of it. He ~~had~~ said "just plain old pus", just like they put it in there." I wanted him to drain the others but he said unless they bothered me it was better to let them alone.

Am sorry about your headaches. They can sure get a person down. I used to have such awful ones but mine were mostly nerves + after I realized what it was + began to get my nerves under control they disappeared. They were always followed by an upset stomach but the origin came was nervous tension. Worry last week

I haven't heard any more about George so guess they didn't get down this way. I wrote to Floyd + asked him to come down to see us but haven't heard from him yet.

If I wasn't any older than your Cuban friend I believe I'd feel like a "spring chicken." And when I think about your age + the real labor attached to your move to Santa Lucia + back I think it was marvelous that you could do it.

I just haven't been able to get down to Orlendo to check on the information about Juannita's entry over here but I don't imagine there would be anything any different from what you got over there. Any way I don't think it of enough importance to hold up her plans about coming. And as far as I know now, (I mean about Herbert's condition) it will be alright for her to come on when she is ready. I'd sure love to go to Miami to get her + if Herbert keeps on improving + gets back to work so I can sew. I just might be able to do so tho it

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would probably be only to meet her at the Bus Station if Mrs. Roberts can get her that far. I wrote Lorina about the 1st of April & told her about her coming & that you were asking Mrs. R. to see her thru Miami. Mrs. R. it seems has had quite a bit of bad luck the past few months & Lorina wondered if she would be physically able to do so. She is still teaching & shortly after school opened last Fall she fell in the school room & broke her foot & had quite a time with that & recently has had an emergency appendix operation & Lorina said she heard that Mrs. R. is no longer able to drive. Does she know Co. Chris Fredericks who used to be around Tucos & Bartle? I think he bought Mrs. Stroots ranch. He is in Miami & not doing anything. Lorina thought if Mrs. R. couldn't do it that Chris would be glad to. He comes up this way occasionally & was out to see Ragin not too long ago. His address is J.C. Frederiksen P.O. Lorina also mentioned Fred Smith's prospective trip to Miami & told me that "Pete's" girl (I guess she means Pete Green) had been wanting so long to come over here to them & "needing help as much as she does now she
