after the correspondence between ourselves; and keep in touch with each other;
and as the older brother it seems to me that it falls to me to set the pace.

We are all well here; and very busy with our work among the sick and
inane. We have been much blessed in this work, and it is growing all the time.

Now if this reaches you; put on a little extra steam, and write me,
if it is only a few words. at once.

There are some very subtle forces at work to completely divide us as
a family; and you know that "A house divided against itself falleth" I have
written two very strong letters of protest to part of the family about their
wrong sentiments as to our family affairs; and have some of the same kind to
write; but I want to get into touch with you at once/ Have just written
Nell at her address given me four years ago Herrera. If this will not reach her
there, please send me her correct present address.
