Dear Brother:

Your letter of a few days ago, to enclose in the family letter and send it on to Walter, has been duly received. Have not gotten the letter away yet, but it will go on shortly, I trust.

Have been quite a jam with the Chicago office in regards to Canadian matters of which I wrote you a few days ago. They have gotten clear off their base in several matters; and I have had to dig into them hard. But I am sure that I right, and that God is leading me on; so I am not concerned about the final outcome. I feel quite sure that I shall have to take a part in this cleanup; and that it can only be done under God's direction, and protection. The trouble now is that the men who think that they are running the thing themselves, and are running it on tremendeous profit making basis for themselves; have got to come down, and let God and His servants have their way. Pray that I may be able to stand in my place, and understand God's plans and purposes as far as need be to keep me out error, and under His protection.

In this connection I have been much instructed and blessed in studying David's proceedure as recorded in Sam:5-17-25. It is well worth a deep prayerful study.
