Dear Brother

I was not able to get all copies of the enclosed letter to Bertha in last night's mail, so am getting to rest going this morning.

I suppose you have been informed that George, on account of his crop conditions, requested that the reunion date be changed from the fore part to the latter part of August. I have been somewhat apprehensive that this might not prove quite so advantageous for you, but have not thus far heard from you as to how it would fit into your affairs. Have supposed, however, that while you might prefer an earlier date, that it would probably be more a matter a preference, rather than of vital necessity, such as George has to face with his crop.

In the meantime I have had a lot of correspondence at this end of the line to get Bertha's ~~reduced~~ reduced to a final day and hour, so that the rest of us would have something definite to shoot at as to our own affairs. Personally I have been rather glad of the change, and sincerely hope that it really fits in well with your best interests.

I think I will send this by "Air Mail" and see how it works out. It works out wonderfully well here, East and West, but my former attempts to get any satisfaction south have been anything but satisfactory.
